Ever been to Arizona? I spend time there each year with family and get out daily to run with local friends. I have learned that they have two types of weather down there: warm and dry or hot and dry. I have to admit, I like the predictability, and my shoes never get "swamped out."


In the North, where most of my year is spent, we get about six months without cold weather, and then... snow, tons of it. But even when winter finally decides to release its icy grip along the big lake (Superior), it still holds on with its frozen iron fist up on the "other side of the hill"—this hill being the Sawtooth Mountains. This snow and ice holds on for a time that seems much longer than reasonable, considering the tallest our mountains get is about 2,000 feet.

Two weeks before the Superior Spring Trail Race, we might have waist-deep snow, then when it goes, our reward is oftentimes a good helping of mud. This year we were

feeling confident, optimistic, cocky eventhe snow was out early and it had not rained in weeks. We were going to have a snow-free, dry, solid trail—perfect...

But then seven days out and somebody turned on the faucet and forgot to turn it off. The shallow dirt-clay mix that tops the granite slab that is the foundation of Northern Minnesota's Boreal forest was deep, it was wet and it was shoe-sucking. One runner was even overheard commenting that the mud was "soul-sucking"-that seems a little extreme to even me.

One of our favorites is when a runner puts dry shoes or socks in a drop bag. Predictably it works out like this: you start the race with dry shoes, they get wet (soaked, muddy, swampy) within the first mile. Five miles later you come rolling into the aid station, change shoes and socks, and within 100 feet (give or take) of leaving, your shoes are trashed again. Well, anyways, to each his own.

Last year's 50k winner, Ben Cogger of Duluth, MN, knows the drill and personally told me he is not afraid of mud. He led "gun to tape" to finish first, but was 12 minutes slower than last year, and he estimates he had the same fitness. Cogger was chased by a pack of the "who's who" in Midwest ultrarunning, but he refused to wait up. On the women's side, Tiffany Kari, also of Duluth, MN, in her second-ever ultra placed first, fresh off of a 3:07 Boston.

Years ago, this race was obscure. Mostly those from the "over-40 crowd" were showing up, and you could register a week before the race—oh, how times have changed. This year we met our field limit in a few hours, up from seven days the year before and seven weeks two years ago. Registration in 2016 will likely be via lottery.

One thing that has not changed is the enthusiasm, fervor and tenacity that our runners bring to the race. We wish everyone could get in, participate and run, but that is just not reality. We need to preserve the intimacy of the race and host a sustainable event
